Re: Alberta Utilities Commission ("AUC") Bulletin 2024-16
Consultation on Improvement to Transmission Rate Proceedings
ENMAX Power Corporation ("EPC") Outline

On August 20, 2024 the AUC issued Bulletin 2024-16 (the "Bulletin") announcing its intention to initiate a consultation on improvements to rates proceedings for transmission utilities. In the Bulletin, the Commission indicated areas where it was seeking feedback to improve the effectiveness of transmission rate proceedings. The AUC also requested parties who intend to participate in the September 12, 2024 virtual roundtable to provide a short outline summarizing what they intend to discuss at the roundtable.

EPC intends to address all of the items listed in the Bulletin. It also wishes to address the following items:

- the \$0.5 million business case threshold for capital projects/programs set in EUB Bulletin 2006-025.1;
- the threshold for post-implementation reviews ("PIRs")
- the threshold to determine the issues lists (for both capital projects/programs and O&M incremental cost items); and
- the process-related initiatives the Commission piloted in EPC's 2023-2025 Transmission GTA,² including:
 - MFR schedules;

- o issues lists;
- o pre-filing technical sessions;
- o pre-hearing case management meetings;
- o post-filing technical sessions;
- o information requests process; and
- o the process for dealing with motions.

Finally, EPC may also address additional items identified by other stakeholders.
