

Notice of hearing Central Calgary Transmission Line Replacement Project

ENMAX Power Corporation has filed an application for transmission development in the city of Calgary

**Proceeding 29583
Application 29583-A001**

The Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC), the independent utilities regulator, will be holding a hearing to review the application and submissions received to consider the electric transmission development application in Proceeding 29583.

Written participation submissions are due February 13, 2025. Written evidence is due March 27, 2025.

ENMAX Power Corporation has applied to replace the 138-kilovolt (kV) Transmission Line 3.82L by extending the existing 138-kV Transmission Line 2.83L approximately 2.5 kilometres from a point near the intersection of 16th Avenue N.E. and Deerfoot Trail N.E. to ENMAX No. 3 Substation. ENMAX has proposed a preferred route and an alternate route for the middle segment of the proposed Transmission Line 2.83L. The preferred route has a primarily overhead configuration while the alternate route has a primarily underground configuration. The Commission may approve either of the proposed routes.

In addition to the construction of Transmission Line 2.83L, ENMAX has also applied to de-energize Transmission Line 3.82L, to alter ENMAX No. 3 Substation, and to reconfigure transmission lines around ENMAX No. 2 and No. 13 substations. The application has been filed under the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act*. Maps of the proposed project are provided at the end of this notice.

To support an open and transparent process, information you send to the AUC will be publicly available to anyone registered in this proceeding. If there is confidential information you would like to file, a request must be made in advance of filing your submission.

Participating in the hearing

If you intend to present evidence at the hearing, you must submit your written evidence by **March 27, 2025**, and be present at the commencement of the hearing. Your written evidence should include your statement about your intended level of participation, including whether you or your representative will:

- Attend the hearing.
- Cross-examine any of the applicant’s witness panels.

Written evidence can be reports prepared by experts or written information (including maps, charts, photographs and narrative statements) prepared by an intervener personally, and clearly identified as such. Any report that was prepared by an expert, and which is being filed in support of an intervener’s position, must clearly state the qualifications of the expert and the name of the intervener who directed that the report was to be prepared. Please be aware that the author of any report or other written evidence that an intervener expects the Commission to rely upon must be available to be cross-examined at the hearing.
